

#### **CONTINUING EDUCATION UNITS**

This program is eligible for 6 continuing education units for Licensed Well Drilling Contractors and 6 continuing education units for Licensed Pump Installers or a total of 12 if you carry both licenses which are due by December 31, 2016!

Continuing Education for water well drillers and water well pump installers. It's the law.

As you know by now, the Indiana General Assembly passed IC 25-39-2-15.5 regarding pump installers license for water wells and continuing education. All pump installers must be licensed and are required to earn 6 hours continuing education units every 2 years. This became effective July 1, 2011. The continuing education offered at this conference will apply to the credit you need by December 31, 2016 for your 2017-2018 recertification.

Reminder this is the end of the 2 year cycle.

#### THOUGHTS OF FALL


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#### NEW OSHA RULES, INCREASED PENALTIES TAKE EFFECT IN AUGUST

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration has finalized two rules set to go into effect in August that could impact NGWA members.

The first rule increases maximum penalties for serious violations, which have not been increased since 1990.

The new maximum penalties have been adjusted for inflation, so the top penalty for serious violations increases from \$7,000 to \$12,471 and the maximum penalty for willful or repeated violations increases from \$70,000 to \$124,709.

In addition, new rules regulating the tracking and reporting of on-the-job injuries goes into effect on August 10.

The rule requires employers to inform employees of their right to report work-related injuries and cannot discourage employees from reporting injuries. A second phase of the rule goes into effect on January 1, 2017 and requires firms employing between 20–249 employees to electronically submit injury information from OSHA's Form 300A. Larger firms employing 250 or more people must report on OSHA Form 300, 300A, and 301.

# EPA ANNOUNCES PLANS TO DEVELOP NATIONAL DRINKING WATER PLAN

Citing the crisis in Flint, Michigan, EPA's top official in the Office of Water, Joel Beauvais, announced EPA's plans to develop a national drinking water action plan.

The plan, which he noted will be released by the end of 2016, focuses on identifying ways to strengthen protections of drinking water, developing plans for emerging and unregulated contaminants, and strategies for the next generation of Safe Drinking Water Act implementation. EPA plans to work closely with state and local regulators throughout development of the proposal.

The announcement also cited a new study underway by the President's Council of Advisors on Science and Technology Policy that will examine the science and technology available to assess the safety of drinking water. The study will also identify existing best practices on how risks to drinking water are assessed and remediated.
